Author Barth Hulley explains his motivation behind the book: “The French system can seem confusingly complex to the newcomer and that’s because, well, it is! Certainly, if you’re unaware of all the options available and the pros and cons of each, then choosing the right freelance structure can be incredibly difficult, if not impossible. I wrote FREELANCE IN FRANCE 2015 for people who simply want to get started – and don’t want to have to spend hours and hours researching French legislation.”
